INVASIVE PLANT PATROL (IPP) TRAINING WORKSHOPS

IPP Manual Control Methods

Workshops are geared for certified SCUBA divers and nondivers provideing surface support for invasive aquatic plant control projects. All divers must show proof of SCUBA certification. **Manual Control I** covers hand-pulling and benthic barrier projects. **Manual Control II** provides training in diver-assisted suction harvesting (DASH). Both workshops include in-lake instruction and practice.
